



BOARD MINUTES: FEBRUARY 6, 2024

The A.A.C.A. South Florida Region Board Meeting of Tuesday, February 6, 2024, was called to Order by President Tomás Hernández at 7:47 p.m., at Rinconcito Latino Café, 9606 SW 72nd Street, Miami, FL 33173.

In Attendance: President Tomás Hernández, 1st Vice President Al Padilla, Treasurer Manny Garcia, Secretary Yovanna Hernández, Immediate Past President Millie Garcia, and Board Members Benjamin Cardonne, Chico Goldsmith, Jean Hawa, Thomas Kosky, Ed Medina, Mike Penn, Paula Valentina Perez, Ira Shapiro, and Bob Squier and guest Volker Ribniger.

Establish a Quorum: President Tomás Hernández was able to establish a quorum with 14 members of the Board present.

First Order of Business - Acceptance of Board Meeting Minutes from Previous Month: President Tomás Hernández asked if everyone present had read the minutes of the January's board meeting; if so, and if there were no questions, comments, or corrections, would someone move to accept the minutes as posted. Jean Hawa made a motion to accept the minutes, Manny Garcia seconded it. Having no other discussion, the motion was voted on and passed.

Second Order of Business – Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Manny Garcia presented a reconciliation statement for January from the club's bank account. He added that with membership renewals coming in, new members, monthly expenses such as board meeting meals, coffee and dessert at the general meeting, storage rental fee and the printing and mailing of *Sidelights*, our treasury is sound.

Nivardo Mora donated money for a sponsorship. Volker Ribniger made a generous donation to the club in which he requested to have a half or full page in *Sidelights* to be utilized by a charity of our choice.

Tomás Hernández used the opportunity to inform us that an AACA National officer is very impressed with our *Sidelights* and website, being among the best in the nation, and suggested using them as a template for other clubs. Ed Medina added that in December we had trouble accessing National on the internet because the server was very slow. Steve Moskowitz called him saying that the problem is solved, the website is up to speed and that we will have our site on an independent server. Ed told Steve that our membership has increased 61% thanks to technology.

Third Order of Business – Membership Report: Ed Medina informed us that we now have 191 families. He had to purge 30 families that did not renew their dues. Ed and Jean Hawa will be calling those who had not paid to encourage them to renew.

General Membership Meeting (February 15, 2024): Jorge Feria was not present at the meeting due to personal matters.

Art Deco Classic Car Show Report: Ira Shapiro said that it was

a fantastic show with a total of 98 cars exhibiting between Saturday and Sunday. He mentioned that the Miami Design Preservation League of Miami was very pleased with our display and both the police and fire departments were very happy with the outcome, especially how organized and prompt the venue was evacuated within 10 minutes. Tomás Hernández thanked Ira for a well-done job.

Biltmore Way Classic Auto Show (March 3, 2024):

- Ed Medina reported that we had 70 pre-registered.
- Ed mentioned that this is an important judged show, and we should have better trophies for the winners. He made a motion to increase it to 30 and One Best of Show trophies. Manny Garcia seconded the motion. The motion was voted on and approved.
- Manny Garcia spoke with someone in the Special Events Department to send a link to make payment.
- Mike Penn will call to have porta-potties delivered.
- Jean Hawa mentioned that she had been questioned by a club member who wondered why the previous minutes stated that car shows would cost \$10 for members and \$20 for non-members, but that the website stated \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members for the Biltmore Show and then \$30/\$40 on day of show. The response was due to the high cost of the show mainly due to the city of Coral Gables fees for permits, police costs, fees for the parking spaces used, barricades, the cost of trophies, refreshments, portable toilet rental, etc. Since former sponsorships were not forthcoming, the monies needed had to come from an entry fee. The Coral Gables show has always been our most expensive show to operate, and that sponsorships have carried those expenses for us. But not this year. The fees for other shows will depend upon the expected expenses and sponsorships. President Hernández added that almost all other clubs charge anywhere from \$25 to \$50 and higher.
- Ira reminded the board that a show budget needed to be presented to the board for review a month in advance of the show. The board will do this via email.
- It was mentioned that the Biltmore Way Car Show is a very popular show with a beautiful venue. Finding other venues is being explored.

Winston Park Car Show (March 16, 2024): This 4th annual car show will be in conjunction with the HOA of Winston Park and the Mustang Club. There will be several food trucks. Sponsors are being sought and the budget will be forthcoming.

Other Club Business:

 Bob Squier motioned that the cost of board meals is an inappropriate club expense. Following a discussion of the higher costs of everything, Ira Shapiro amended and seconded the motion to state that the board members would pay for their own meals and that the club would pick up the tab for dessert and coffee as done for the general meetings. Establish a Quorum: President Tomás Hernández was able to establish a quorum with 13 members of the Board present.

First Order of Business - Acceptance of Board Meeting Minutes from Previous Month: President Tomás Hernández asked if everyone present had read the minutes of the February's board meeting; if so, and if there were no questions, comments, or corrections, would someone move to accept the minutes as posted. Jean Hawa made a motion to accept the minutes, Ed Medina seconded it. Having no other discussion, the motion was voted on and passed.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING OF FEBRUARY 15

Reported by Jean Hawa

Ed Medina introduced our special guest speaker, Nelson Diaz and his employees, Andres Camacho and Yordanis Beaton, who are well known by some of our club members who have used 'iDetailMiami'.

Even though there were no visual aids, the presentation provided great insight to our members. Mr. Diaz explained that his clients need to know what he and his team are doing to their car, truck, boat or airplane. Whether it's a paint correction, cutting a compound, having a mirror finish, wet sanding, detailing, etc., they document and warranty their work.

Maintenance is key, but it is as important to use complement brands that work. For example, they use Gtech ceramic coating because it is an easy and reliable product that chemically bonds to paint and glass, making the vehicle scratch resistant and protected from UV degradation. There are many clear coatings out there, but the ceramic is three times stronger than a clear coat.

Ceramic coating can be sprayed on like some do with paint or clear, but you have to tape up the whole car and cover all trim, otherwise you may overspray and get it on places you don't want such as the wheels. Diaz hand applies it panel by panel, coat it, buff it, coat, buff, etc.. Color matching is hard, but dent paint jobs are doable. Extra steps are needed for chipped paint. There are many myths about using circular motions. They also use rotary dual action and orbital polishers.

STEPS: For the best protection one needs to use the proper lint-free towels, not more towels, and treated water. They prefer the Klin brand from the U.K.. Untreated water, out of the tap, has too many minerals. Water spots are avoided if one uses soft water. Pre-wash the vehicle, having separate water buckets for each step and dry with a mitt. A Metrovac 4.0 HP can be used to blow water from crevices.

Tape the area to be painted. Find the worst area to do a

trial test. Reference the paint under light and the underside to find the right color. Remove the compound to avoid defects and apply the ceramic coating. A video is made the

next day explaining the products and process used.

Wheels: Can be spray coated or hand-applied, using a special application for the right amount of coating.

Wrapping a car is the latest version to use. One can change the color every six months or wash their car every six months, if desired. Paint protection is important. Too many people rub dirt into their car when they don't wash their cars properly. They should be washed, dried and then sprayed with SIO2 which revives the color.

Ed Medina brought his 1962 Tempest with original paint and many defects to IDetailMiami and gave testimony by stating "It looks amazing."

To encapsulate everything in the presentation, 'iDetailMiami' specializes in automotive, marine and aircraft detailing. From sedans to SUVs, they offer a range of auto detailing packages to suit the clients needs. Their services cover everything from thorough exterior washes and polishing to interior vacuuming, leather conditioning, and odor removal. Paint Restoration, Paint Correction, Ceramic Coating, PPF and much more. We learned a lot.



This is how they can be hung by their straps. You can use the straps to carry them as well.



As mentioned before, this side section can be removed which subsequently gives you side access to under your car. That's a benefit that many ramps don't provide. Now that's awesome!



This is a view from the front bottom of a C7. Look at the amount of lift you get from the front (about 17 inches). This much space allows you to get in there to change your oil or detail undercarriage of your car. Also, these don't slip as you make your approach. I have used mine many times and they always stay put. Each ramp only weighs 17 lbs, which makes them easy to carry and store. In closing, as a good safety practice, I recommend that you use wheel chocks on a tire(s) that are not lifted.


